Consultation on proposed Scottish Parliament Boundary changes at Princes Gate and Greenacres by Robroyston

The Boundary Commission for Scotland is seeking the public's views on proposed changes to the Scottish Parliament constituency boundary between Glasgow Provan constituency and Strathkelvin and Bearsden constituency, and the Scottish Parliament region boundary between Glasgow region and West Scotland region, at Princes Gate and Greenacres by Robroyston. The consultation ends on 17 May 2013.

The proposed changes are in response to changes to the boundary between East Dunbartonshire and Glasgow City council areas in this vicinity in April 2011. The Scottish Parliament constituency and region boundaries in the vicinity of Princes Gate now differ from the administrative boundary between Glasgow City and East Dunbartonshire council areas.

The proposed changes, will affecting around 20 electors, and will allow the Scottish Parliament constituency and region boundaries to be aligned with the council area boundary in time for the next Scottish Parliament elections in May 2016.

The Boundary Commission for Scotland expects to make recommendations from this review to the Secretary of State later in 2013.
